
As a compact city, it is possible to get anywhere within the city-centre on foot in 15-minutes.

University Square

University of Central Lancashire, Fylde Rd, Preston, Lancashire, PR17DP

University Square is a modern, accessible outdoor event location with the capacity for live music, sporting, and corporate events. Just a stone's throw from the city-centre, the square is a popular destination for students and visitors.

University Square welcomes various events throughout the year. It hosted the Mobile Events Tent and has featured live music, performances, and cultural and community events. The University of Central Lancashire also regularly delivers a range of outdoor events on the square, including, Graduation celebrations, The Lancashire Science Festival, Craft and Food Markets, Conferences, Dinner events, and more.

Measuring over 2000m² the square holds up to 4000 people* with data and power infrastructure and has a premises licence.

Avenham and Miller Park

South Meadow Lane, Preston, Lancashire, PR18JP

Avenham and Miller Park are in the heart of the city yet feel far removed from their urban surroundings. The parks are interlinked with beautiful scenic paths creating one large and diverse space with lots to offer.

The parks create a retreat away from the hustle and bustle of the city, mixing the natural beauty of the River Ribble with landscaped gardens, exotic trees, and historical structures. Due to their central location and six main entrance points, Avenham and Miller Park are easily accessible by foot, bike and have car parks and public transport hubs nearby.

Avenham Park

The natural amphitheatre in Avenham Park is the ideal spot for events. The park's paths circle this large green space and offer serene views from all angles. Avenham Park is also home to the Pavilion Café, and hosts various events throughout the year, including the annual Preston Egg Rolling event, outdoor theatre shows, vintage fairs, and fun events.

Miller Park

You will find many picturesque locations in Miller Park suitable for events. Tree-lined paths run alongside the River Ribble and continue through Avenham Park. Home to a set of historical steps which lead up to the Derby Walk getting its name from the Earl of Derby statue that stands tall overlooking the path. Miller Park has many fascinating and historical points of interest, which include its listed water fountain, rock features, spiralling gardens, and a large basalt rock from the Giant's Causeway.

Moor Park

Moor Park Avenue, Preston, Lancashire, PR16AS

The Grade II* listed Moor Park sits on the outskirts of the city-centre, retaining a Green Flag Award in recognition of its heritage and maintenance.

As the oldest and largest parkland in the city, Moor Park offers vast open green spaces and notable beauty spots. Surrounding by a network of paths, Moor Park offers an extensive, flexible location ideal for events.

Throughout the year, Moor Park hosts a range of events, from night-time bat walks, historic-tours and music festivals; there are plenty of events to get excited about. This location could provide the versatile space you're looking for.

Preston Bus Station


Derby Street, Preston, Lancashire, PR11DT

Preston Bus Station is the central bus station in Preston, Lancashire. Constructed in 1969, the station received grade II listed building status in September 2013.

Renowned for its brutalist architecture, Preston Bus Station could be the iconic backdrop for your next big event. A large concrete area is positioned just in front of this busy spot, and the bus station has already hosted largescale events as part of the annual Encounter Festival.

Preston boasts excellent connectivity and is at the heart of the transport network in Lancashire. The architecturally unique bus station is the largest in Europe and provides a central location for any event.

The Flag Market

Moor Park Avenue, Preston, Lancashire, PR16AS

The historic Flag Market, located in Preston city-centre, facing the Harris Museum, Art Gallery, and Library. The main square features the Cenotaph and other historical buildings, eateries, shops, and bars.

Events take place throughout the year on the Flag Market, including artisan markets, outdoor theatre, live music, carnivals, and light switch-on events. Locals and visitors alike often pass through the Flag Market during their visit to the city-centre, as it's a key location for retail and socialising. This large space is flexible and is suited to any event. Events here are sure to create a buzz with passers-by.
